
What is an *invasive* species?

In 1999, President Bill Clinton signed Executive Order 13112, defining *invasive species* as:

- 1) Non-native to the ecosystem under consideration, and
- 2) Species whose introduction causes or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health



1) Non-native



2) Harmful

- Hurt native habitats and ecosystems
- Change the food chain
- Can increase erosion and fire hazard
- Hurt fishing and boating industries
- Decrease property value
- May be poisonous to humans or animals






